Our year is off and running! It has been a little different start to our year with several early out days due to the heat, but I am hoping those days are now behind us. I wanted to touch base on a few items as the year gets going.

- * We have several new teacher faces this year. Mrs. Kristy Huerter is new in our kindergarten hallway. Mrs. Heurter has worked previously in our district and brings several years of lower elementary experience to Madison. Mrs. Sara Blom is a new member of our first grade team. - * We are working on a new concept this year called **Professional Learning Communities** (PLC's). This process focuses on *student learning* (vs teaching), *teacher collaboration* and is *results focused*. We will be taking a closer look at student achievement data as a driver for how we instruct students. The second aspect of PLC's involves teachers collaborating together to help students achieve at a higher level. This means that the grade level teachers are working more closely together to meet the needs of all the students in their grade level and not just the students in their individual classroom. Do not be surprised if your first grader comes home and says they spent some time in another first grade classroom that day working on math, for example. The teachers at each grade level are sharing students more frequently as a way to more efficiently meet student needs. This also involves our Reading Plus teachers, community reading volunteers, Central College students, classroom associates and parent volunteers. As you can see, we have a number of adults at Madison that are working together to provide an efficient and effective learning process for your student. Our goal is to place resources where they are needed so our students can learn at a high level.
- * This Wednesday we are remembering our national **Patriot Day** by dressing up in red, white and blue. Patriot Day is meant to remember citizens who lost their lives during the Sept. 11th terrorist attacks. Teachers will be lightly addressing the meaning of the remembrance in their classrooms in an age appropriate fashion. It may be a good idea to have that discussion at home prior to Wednesday, just so home and school are on the same page with this issue.
