## ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

The faculty and administration of Pella Middle School have developed a policy for students who are failing classes. A list with any student failing a class will be compiled by the iStudy Supervisor through Infinite Campus software, and the list will be compiled approximately every four weeks. See complete schedule in the link above. Students failing any class will be placed on the Academic and Ineligibility List. Students not participating in an extracurricular activity will be required to stay after school on Wednesdays from 1:45 to 3:15 for two weeks. Students participating in extracurricular activities will be rendered ineligible under this policy to represent Pella Middle School in any public extracurricular performance, as well as required to stay after school on Wednesdays from 1:45 to 3:15 for two weeks. Once a student is placed on the Academic and Ineligibility List, he/she will not be removed until the end of the second week (i.e. Wednesday morning through Tuesday end of day for two weeks in a row).

# What If...?

## 1. **What if** my student has *an appointment during practice?*

- i. First, contact the office and hi/her coaches via email, or call Mindy or Danielle in the office. Then the office will inform coaches.
- ii. If he/she is not waiting for you, and he/she is inside practicing in the gym, knock on the East gym door at the Middle School or the Southeast gym door at Jefferson. Students or coaches will hear you when you knock.



## 2. **What if** I need to *get a hold of my student* during the school day?

- i. Contact the office, and we will get a hold of your student for you as quickly as possible depending on the urgency of the situation.

## 3. **What if** my *child is sick during the school day*, and he/she contacts me via email, text, or phone?

- i. First, remind him/her to go to the nurse or office, so we can determine if his/her symptoms warrant needing to go home.
- ii. Second, wait to come to pick him/her up until the office contacts you of their symptoms.

## Home Football Game Expectations



1. Students are to remain in the assigned areas during football games. Students using the concession stand or restrooms should return to the assigned area as soon as possible. The concessions area is not an area for socializing. Be courteous of those wanting/needing to access concessions.

**Assigned Areas:** K-6: With parents or south end of stadium


**MS-HS: North bleachers or north end of stadium**
