Information on the New Iowa Statewide Assessment

The state of lowa has introduced a new state assessment that will be given to every student in grades 3-11 during the fourth quarter of this year. The test is called the lowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress or ISASP. The Pella Community Schools will give these tests during the week of April 15. Grades 5, 8, and 10 will take an additional science test the following week. Here are some things you may want to know about the tests:

- The tests are not timed. Students can take as long as they need but the following guidelines have been given to us for planning.
 - Reading allow 60 minutes for grades 3-11
 - Math allow for 60 minutes for grades 3-11
 - o Language Arts / Writing allow 120 minutes for grades 3-11
 - Science allow 60 minutes for grades 5, 8, and 10
- Grades 3-6 will be taking the tests in paper format while grades 7-11 will take them online.
- Questions are now varied in style including essay, short answer, and multiple choice.

Each student has been taking practice tests in each area. This introduced them to the format and will help them learn the tools that are built into the online system for grades 7-11. If you would like to view the practice tests for any grade level, they are available at this link.
